

**MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND BOROUGH COUNCIL
OF THE BOROUGH OF AUDUBON PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW
JERSEY, HELD AUGUST 18, 2014 IN THE ANNEX BUILDING AT 7:00 PM.**

A regular meeting of the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Audubon Park was convened in the Annex Building, 504 Road A, Audubon Park, NJ on Monday, August 18, 2014, at 7:00 PM.

Mayor Pennock requested all stand for the flag salute.

Mayor Pennock announced that Chapter 231, Public Law 1975 requires adequate notice of this meeting be provided. This was done by placing Annual Notice in the Courier-Post and Retrospect Newspapers and by posting on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building.

ROLL CALL: Councilman Carpinelli, Councilman Delengowski, Councilwoman DiPasquale, and Councilwoman Hook. Councilman Jones (not excused) and Councilwoman Lewis (excused) were absent.

GENERAL DISCUSSION:

The following was discussed by Mayor and Borough Council:

- Inviting the Camden County Freeholders to hold their Annual Meeting in Audubon Park next year at the School Building;
- Establishing an Energy Conservation Committee to consist of Councilman Delengowski and Christopher Stokes;
- USDA Application still pending approval;
- Waiting on Agreement from Bellmawr Public Works for Shared Services;
- Councilman Carpinelli requested that Borough Council take another look at the salaries paid to the office staff. He believes the office staff is under paid;
- Councilwoman DiPasquale informed the Borough Council that Rosemary Romeo was hired to work as the Librarian starting August 14, 2014 and Kate Sullivan will be acclimating her to the position;
- Councilwoman Hook mentioned the American Flags that need to be taken down because they are falling down, signs/decorations that are put up in town and what is the deadline for taking those items down, trash issues, and finally she asked why one individual that lives along Peter's Creek is entitled to privacy; if privacy is going to be afforded to one than it should be afforded to all;
- 4th of July Halloween Party; and
- Audubon Schools have a new Superintendent that will be meeting with the Mayor. The new Superintendent wants to reach out and include the Borough Council on happenings within our school system.

With no further agenda business, a motion was made by Councilwoman DiPasquale to open the meeting to the public, seconded by Councilman Delengowski, with all members affirmatively concurring:

Betty White, 2 Mockingbird Lane – Ms. White asked which newspaper the Borough uses to advertise notices. The Mayor responded the Retrospect and the Courier Post is secondary. She wanted to know the difference between the Corporation and the Borough. The Mayor told her the easiest way to explain the difference is, we are the government and in charge of public safety and tax dollars, the Corporation is the Landlord-Tenant.

Councilwoman DiPasquale informed the Mayor and Borough Council that she reached out to Diener Bricks to get information regarding the commemorative bricks for the school. The one thing they pointed out was that the Borough need to get someone else to install the bricks.

With no further comments from the public, Councilman Delengowski made a motion to close the meeting to the public, seconded by Councilwoman DiPasquale, with all members affirmatively concurring.

There being no further discussion, Councilman Delengowski moved to close the public hearing, seconded by Councilwoman DiPasquale. All ayes.
