

**MINUTES OF THE WORKING SESSION OF THE MAYOR AND BOROUGH COUNCIL
OF THE BOROUGH OF AUDUBON PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW
JERSEY, HELD OCTOBER 20, 2014 IN THE ANNEX BUILDING AT 7:00 PM.**

A regular meeting of the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Audubon Park was convened in the Annex Building, 504 Road A, Audubon Park, NJ on Monday, October, 20, 2014, at 7:00 PM.

Mayor Pennock requested all stand for the flag salute.

Mayor Pennock asked everyone to remain standing for a moment of silence to all those Police and Firefighters that sacrificed their lives over the last year.

Mayor Pennock announced that Chapter 231, Public Law 1975 requires adequate notice of this meeting be provided. This was done by placing Annual Notice in the Courier-Post and Retrospect Newspapers and by posting on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building.
