CHARLES “CHARLIE” H. BEEMAN ***(December 19, 1948 to May 13, 2012)***

At this time, the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Audubon Park remembers our fellow Councilman Charles Beeman. Charlie served this town for 17 years as a member of Council and has acted as Council President for the past 6 years. His contribution to our small town will always be remembered and appreciated. Our sympathies go out to his wife Connie and his entire family.

Dear Friends and Neighbors:

As spring begins to turn to summer, I would like to bring you up to speed on a few of the more pertinent items on the business plate of the Borough Council:

- We have completed and approved our 2012 Operating Budget. With many constraints imposed upon us by the State of New Jersey and rising costs, we were able to adopt our budget with only an average of \$1.00 per house per month increase. As all of you already know, we were originally unable to budget for Courtesy busing for our public grade school children. As we indicated in our letter mailed to each household, we continued to explore options and have found a way to pay for busing from September through December 2012.
- We have accumulated and dedicated over \$60,000.00 in grant money to begin a Peter's Creek Bank Restoration Project. As we hurdle all the legal obligations for this enormous project, we will provide residents information with our vision for beautifying our Creek Area. This project could not be underway without the many hours of planning and preparation of Chris Stokes. Chris has volunteered to head this project along with all our eco and recycling affairs. We could not entertain this enormous project without the cooperation of the Audubon Mutual Housing Corporation Board of Trustees. Trustee President Denise Balderama, and many of her fellow trustees, have stepped up to work hand in hand with us on our first joint project in years. It is cooperation like this that will benefit our town and for that the members of Council and I are extremely grateful.
- Over the course of the next month, you will notice that "A", "B", and "C" Roads will each have a new speed bump installed. These speed bumps are to assist the Haddon Township Police Department in an effort to slow down the drivers who choose to disregard our speed limits. Just remember, if you are driving carefully and paying attention, these bumps will not be a problem for you.
- Council and myself have finished our summer entertainment schedule and this issue contains the details.

This is just a sampling of some of the business conducted by Council and myself this first half of the year. We encourage you to attend our meetings and follow us on our Borough Website (www.audubonparknj.org).

Membership rates, along with additional information on the registration process, are listed on the form. Pool Memberships go on sale starting May 14th in the Tax Office.

To receive your pool tags, please complete the application and bring it with your cash or check (made payable to the Township of Haddon) to the Tax Office at the Municipal Building. To receive the Haddon Township resident rate, you must be able to present proof of residency for each individual upon request. If applying for a family membership either as residents or non-residents, proof of dependency for each child is required. A list of items accepted as proof can be found on the application form. Haddon Township does not keep residency or dependency information from previous years. If you have any questions about pool registration, call the Municipal office at 856-854-1176, ext. 4114, 4118, and 4120.
